

Kitchen Expansion Project

PER TRUSTEES of DMC

The following is a breakdown of the progress / proposed for the **Kitchen Project to date:**

Foundations and floor slab complete Rough wall and roof framing complete Shingles installed and tied into existing roofing Demolition of the existing cabinets, ceiling and exterior wall complete Demolition of existing window system complete Door / window infill with drywall complete FRP installed on all walls except South wall Exterior walls and new portion of the roof insulated Plumbing sanitary tied into existing Water lines tied into existing and insulated Gas line extended from above the janitor's closet into kitchen space Electrical demolition complete Electrical wall and ceiling rough-in complete New electrical panel set with conduits extended into ceiling space Windows being delivered January 29th Casework has been field measured and in production Finish FRP and stainless panels under the hood Stainless tables for equipment under the hood have been ordered Stainless island is in stock Review potential of installing floor tile and some cabinetry then protecting during balance of construction The hood continues to be an issue with various discussions with The State. We are currently looking to alter the design to meet their requirements and have the exhaust vent through the roof and not the sidewall. This would solve several issues, but we have limited headroom and need to complete the engineering to make this happen. Once approved the hood is 4 weeks out for delivery. Several scopes of work depend on the hood being in place prior to being able to complete the next task so this will hold up the schedule. With this back and forth
