The New Year is upon us here at Salt Youth, and we have officially gotten back into the swing of things! We are kicking off 2026 with a study in the book of James in which the kids are learning how to become doers of the word rather than merely listeners. As Christians, we are sometimes lulled into believing that just by saying the right things or thinking the right things, our actions don't matter all that much. We may believe that just because we said “the Sinner’s Prayer” at some specific point in our lives, we have done everything we needed to do to be right with God, and there is nothing else that we can or should do. However, while we are indeed saved by grace through faith in Christ alone (Ephesians 2:8-9), we are called to *live* out that faith. Just a verse later in Ephesians 2:10, the Apostle Paul declares, “For we are God’s workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance as our way of life” (Berean Standard Bible). A fundamental aspect of the reality of us being made into new creations is our dedication to living out the commands of Christ and doing good works. Keeping in line with this thinking, James boldly asserts that faith is not just ineffectual or benign but *dead* without doing what God has commanded (James 2:26). With this in mind, we are called as Christians to not simply intellectually agree with what Scripture teaches *only* but to practice what Jesus preached. We are called to imitate Him in all that we do and serve Him where we can. We are called to purge the sin from our lives and give everything to Christ. We are commissioned to be holy as the Lord our God is holy (Leviticus 19:2).

In the spirit of doing good works and living at our faith, on February 17th, Salt Youth will be hosting a Shrove Tuesday pancake dinner here at DMC. The youth will be serving to help raise money to cover the cost for them to attend the Encounter Youth Conference in April. This conference is a time for youth within Allegheny-West to take time to gather in fellowship, study the Word, and grow deeper in their walks with Christ. 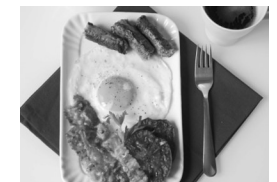

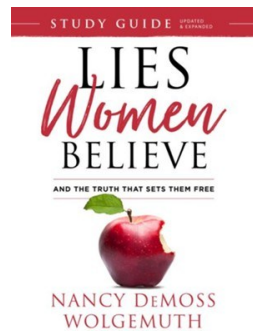

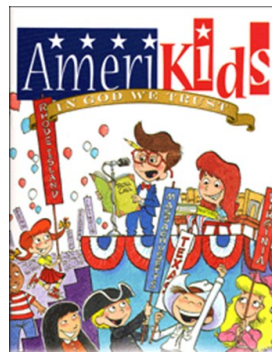
